

## **SPRG CHAIRMAN RICHARD TSANG IS INDUCTED INTO HKIM DISTINGUISHED HALL OF FAME**

(Hong Kong, 7 December 2022) – Richard Tsang, Chairman and Founder of Strategic Public Relations Group Limited (“SPRG” or the “Group”) has been inducted into the Hong Kong Institute of Marketing (“HKIM”) Distinguished Hall of Fame. The accolade is in recognition of Richard’s outstanding contributions to his profession and the community.

To mark 40 years of excellence, HKIM launched the Hall of Fame this year as a means to honour people who have achieved phenomenal success in their own profession. The eight inductees not only served as role models in their respective field, but also showed enthusiasm in nurturing young talent and giving back to society.

Richard established SPRG at 1995 and subsequently transformed the five-person agency into one of the largest PR networks in Asia Pacific. In providing professional and high-quality services, SPRG has garnered over 500 local, regional and international awards and honours, and is in fact the only Hong Kong-based PR network to be ranked by PRovoke and PRWeek on their global top-tier lists.

In addition, he founded Strategic CSR Network in 2014, a registered not-for-profit organisation and one-stop platform aimed at serving underprivileged communities in Hong Kong.

Indicative of Richard's long-standing commitment to also helping nurture PR talent, he has been a part-time lecturer at his alma mater – The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), for a quarter century. Furthermore, he is an adjunct professor at The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong, and an advisor to the communication schools of other universities. In addition, Richard established the CUHK RTCL Scholarship in 2005, SPRG Scholarship in 2015 – part of SPRG's 20th anniversary celebrations, and more recently, SPRG FCF scholarship. Richard has both directly and indirectly touched the lives of many PR professionals who have gone on to contribute to the industry as well.
